Patrick E. Deady

Patrick E. Deady joined Hogan Marren Babbo & Rose, Ltd. in 1996 to become head of HMBR's Litigation Practice, Mr. Deady brings an extensive civil and criminal litigation background to the firm, with ten years of experience as a federal prosecutor and now more than 30 years in private practice. He is responsible for supervising the firm's labor and employment, health care, government fraud, education law, commercial and white collar defense litigation.

Mr. Deady has conducted jury and bench trials in federal and state courts and argued before the United States Courts of Appeals and the Illinois Appellate Courts, in a wide range of cases involving bribery, extortion, public corruption, civil rights conspiracy, securities fraud, commodities fraud, tax evasion, criminal and civil RICO violations, Medicaid fraud, insurance fraud, sexual discrimination, breach of contract, breach of fiduciary duty, Illinois trade secrets violations and insurance coverage disputes. Since joining the firm, Mr. Deady has represented the firm's hospital and health system clients in federal false claim act and whistleblower litigation, antitrust investigations and Medicare, Medicaid and insurance reimbursement disputes. He and the firm successfully defended Advocate Healthcare System in a \$250 million antitrust claim brought by United Healthcare.

Mr. Deady brought his white-collar criminal practice to the firm and continues to represent organizations and individuals in grand jury and regulatory investigations, administrative proceedings, and trials arising out of inquiries into public corruption, financial misconduct and government fraud. He regularly represents organizations in investigations conducted by the offices of the inspector generals of federal and state agencies and the City of Chicago. Of particular note in his white-collar practice, Mr. Deady and the firm defended at trial and on appeal one of several Chicago City Hall employees charged in a patronage hiring fraud scheme, *Sorich v. United States*, 555 U.S. 1204 (2009).

Mr. Deady has also represented labor organizations and pension and benefit funds in a wide range of matters involving sexual harassment in the workplace, trade jurisdictional disputes, contract formation and collective bargaining disputes, in arbitration, bankruptcy proceedings, ERISA collection and alter ego actions, and in unfair labor practice charges and election petitions before the National Labor Relations Board and Illinois State Labor Board. Mr. Deady was lead attorney in a successful class-action lawsuit brought by employees of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago challenging the District's elimination of \$38 million in deferred compensation. *Gaweda v. MWRD*, 2010 CH 52264 (Cook Cty.). Most recently, Mr. Deady and the firm successfully defended several former union officers of a Teamsters local charged with breach of fiduciary duty in a federal action, seeking disgorgement of \$1.3 million of the officers' salaries. *Kouba v. Flynn*, Case No. 15 C 11211 (March 27, 2019, N.D. Ill.).
